Jean volunteers at El Centro Hispanico, working with immigrant children and their parents, tailoring their English lessons to job

and survival skills. She also volunteers for Bold Justice, an organization that succeeded in ending the arrest of youth for non-violent misdemeanors, instead suing civil citations. This legislation has thus far saved 31,000 children from an arrest record that would have marked them for life. When her church had to pivot to on-line services due to the pandemic, Jean recorded Bible readings, prayers and reflections for them to use. Jean says that when she was a teacher her rewards were intrinsic but now in retirement her volunteer work has become a source of joy.

#### Florida Senate Bill 84.

It is a proposal that will in effect demolish the Florida Retirement System. Passage would abolish the current Florida Retirement System which provides for guaranteed "defined benefits" at retirement and would require teacher enrollment in a 401(K) Investment Plan rather that would provide no guaranteed benefits. Similar plans were created in Alaska, Michigan and West Virginia have proven to be a disastrous mistake. Florida teachers, law enforcement and fire personnel, and city, county and state employees deserve better. Please contact your senator and representative in opposition to this bill.

It is that time again -2020 Income Tax Returns - and it is NEVER too early to start. Last year COVID provided a delay, this year there is NO EXTENDED DEADLNE. Taxes are due on April 15, 2021! There is some good news. There is a new tax return for seniors called 1040 SR. This form has larger text, less shading and an easier to is that the form lists bigger senior specific standard deductions for those over age 65. Another plus for this year is that Stimulus Checks are not considered income and are not Flashes, texts or calls not taxable and if you are one of the people who is missing a stimulus check (or part of), it can be claimed on the 2020 form as a tax credit called the Recovery Rebate Credit. If you need assistance with your Income Tax Return, the IRS offers FREE assistance for seniors with two programs: 1 - the Tax Counseling for Elderly Program (TCE) and 2 - the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA). You can check on the IRS.gov site to see if you qualify for this free service. As if filing taxes is not "taxing" enough, we are also being warned about the spam, phishing, and other red flags for fraud by cybercriminals during tax season. Morgan Stanley suggests that we request an

Identity Protection Pin if using the IRS site. Use a Multi-Factor Authentication whenever it is offered and to file early to be ahead of any cybercriminals who might try to use your Social Security number. Our pursuit of safety continues. Recently, one of our members' phone was hacked. Do you know if you have been hacked? Do you know what to do if you have read format. Another plus been hacked? Here are some suggestion from various on line sources. If your phone experiences any of the following, you may have been hacked: frequent battery drain, strange pop ups, unusual lights or made by you, higher than normal data usage, or appearance of apps you don't recognize. If you have been hacked, here are some suggestions: change passwords, select a highly rated password manager, remove apps you do not recognize, check your bank statements, be careful about using public Wi-Fi, turn on two factor authentication, deauthorize apps on Facebook, Twitter, Google, etc., delete sensitive information from your account, tell you friends/ contacts and keep your phone updated.) When next we meet it will be April 1st so Happy April Fools' Day in advance. April 2nd is a little more important for two reasons: World Autism Awareness Day and International Children's Book Day. 
