In 1995 and 1999, Gadson created two South Florida Super Bowl bronze commemorative sculptures called "The Quarterback" and "The Kicker." Mr. Gadson has also created sculptures for Darden Restaurants, JM Family Enterprises, The International Swimming Hall of Fame, Broward Audobon Society, and The African-American Research Library.
