cially teenagers - from having access to guns. In the US, there are 1,700 child and teen homicides by guns every year. In 2016, over 3000 children died by firearms. This includes suicides - children as young as 10 are sometimes suicidal. Nine out of 10 people who attempt suicide and fail won't try again. Having access to a gun increases their chance of success. Every 15 hours, a woman is killed by an intimate partner. Availability of a gun increases the risk of death by 500%.






