COLA would almost double your annual pension, which would hopefully allow your standard of living to keep up with rising prices and inflation. Last year there was a war in the Florida Legislature as some legislators tried to do away with the

COLA for people in the State Retirement System, according to District 10 Legislative Representative



Nowadays most of us are doing some sort of business on the Internet.

More and more it is becoming almost mandatory that we transact most of our essential business online. As we do, criminals are getting smarter and the chance of our records being compromised becomes more of a possibility each day. We are constantly being told to be vigilant of what is happening with our accounts. Hackers are able to steal your password and then get access to your accounts. Consumer Reports magazine advises not to use the same password for multiple accounts or use personal references in your

password.

Don't keep a written record of your password in an insecure place. Make a strong password. It should have at least eight characters including an upper case and lower case letter and a speculum character. Don't use common words, names or facts from your life. Write down whole passwords if you must, but keep them under lock and key. When using a password site look for "https" in the site's address. (The "s" means "secure.") Keep the hackers away.
