Elaine also hosted the syndicated Travel Holiday Radio Show

and was a commentator for the National Public Radio station KWMU. She hosted a primetime television program, Viets Beat, for KMOV-TV in St. Louis and won two local Emmys. She was featured on National Public Radio station WLRN with Jeff "Dexter" Lindsay on *Literary* Florida. She was inducted into the St. Louis Media Halls of Fame in 2011. 
Our speaker was Elaine Viets. I 😼 had read several of her books and

The pursuit of happiness is one goal that is constantly in our lives. With some of us it is the next big thing that is just over the hill; with others it is right here in front of us. Todd Patkin author of *Finding Happiness*, stated that "happiness is the culmination of all of the actions, choices, and habits that fill our day, as well as how we think about them." Plainly, happiness is a state of mind. A number of experts found that these five things were key to finding happiness. (1) the highest level of happiness was found with the most stable, and most contented relationships. (2) A study at Lake Forest University participants found that they felt happier when they were more outgoing and less happy when they were withdrawn. (3) When the editors of forbes.com gave strangers a

small sum of

money and told one half of the group to spend it all on themselves and the other half to share it with others, the group that had shared it with others felt much happier at the end of the day than the other group. (4) Studies from the University of Pennsylvania's Positive Psychology show that downcast people who wrote three good things that happened to them each day for six months reported an improved outlook. (5) A small study from the University of Connecticut suggested that even slight dehydration compromised the moods of its female participants. Hydrate yourself.
