Statistics show that Senior Citizens are twice as likely to die or be injured in a fire as the rest of the population. Following some important safety tips can keep you Never put water on a grease from being in this group. Here are some things that are recommended by the Broward Sheriff Fire Rescue Department.

**A working smoke alarm is stove as a heating device. most important in helping you survive a fire. Be sure that everyone in your home can be awakened by the sound of the alarm. Test your alarm once a month and change the batteries twice a cool, open it slowly and get year. When the time changes, change the batteries. **Have an escape plan and make sure everyone is familiar with it.

**If there is a smoker in the be sure to tell the dishouse there should be no smoking in bed. Use large deep ashtrays. Never leave smoking materials unattended. Wet the contents before disposing.

**Do not run extension cords under the furniture or burning building! rugs and never overload extension cords.

**If you have an electrical

problem call a trained professional to fix it.

**When cooking never leave your stove unattended and watch what you are cooking. fire - use baking soda or a lid to smother the fire. If you have an oven fire, turn off the oven and keep the door closed. Never use your **If you do have a fire (hopefully never) and you are prepared, you can survive. When you hear the alarm get out of bed, stay low to the floor. Feel the door, if it is to the nearest exit. If it is warm follow your alternate escape route. If you are unable to leave your room, call the fire department and patcher you are trapped. Then you can try to seal the door with wet towels. Do not stop to collect valuables or pets. Pets will find their own way out. When you get out, stay out. Never re-enter a Be safe - Be happy,


