

the state because there were not any nearby public high schools for black children in those times.

When she later graduated from Florida Memorial College (then in St. Augustine), she returned to teach at Attucks Elementary School at the invitation of the principal, Mr.

Joseph Ely. She will never forget that first year of teaching, in which she had a primary class of 100 children and no help!

Later she furthered her studies at Tuskegee University and married her sweetheart when he returned from World War II. She taught in Boca Raton, Miami, and returned to Broward County in 1950. in Lauderdale Manors. During the 1960's Ethel went to teach at Lauderdale Manors when the public schools in Broward County were racially integrated.

Retiring in 1982 she has remained active in the community and is involved with many activities, including the Friends of the African American Research Library and the Cotillion for teenage girls sponsored by the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority. Ethel lives in Melrose Park and likes to be reminded to attend the BCREA meetings.
