According to Guardian Ad Litem representative Kerry-Ann Brown, there are more than 3200 children between the ages of 0-5 in Broward County at the present time in need of Guardian Ad Litem services. Only 52% of them have one. She is hoping she can convince some BCREA members to become guardians to fill this need. Guardians are required to visit their children once a month to evaluate their living conditions. Other requirements to be a guardian are:

*You must be fingerprinted *Attend training sessions totaling 30 hours - includes court observations *Have an interview

*You'll be accompanied by a supervisor on your first visit After that you set your own visitation schedule at your convenience. You have the right to speak with teachers and doctors and you have access to medical records. Basically you become like a parent except the child doesn't live with you. They may be living with grandparents or other relatives, in foster care or in group homes. Sometimes those given the responsibility for one or more children have difficulty providing for them. A group called "Voices for Children of Broward



County" provide snack boxes for kids who don't have enough food. They are able to help only 50 families. To get additional information, you may access the GAL website at http://guardianadlitem.org
