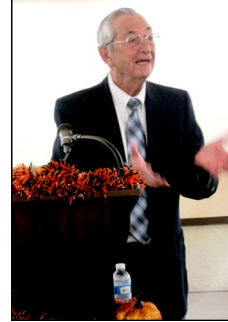

"When taking meds by mouth," Dr. Katz says, "drink water first!" Senior citizens especially need to lubricate their stomachs to prevent pills from attaching to the stomach wall. Water is the best liquid for taking meds. Do NOT use grapefruit juice! If directions say, "Take on an empty stomach, be sure to do that. Some meds attach themselves to food and you get no absorb-

some in the PM. Follow directions. And, it's best to be consistent - take the same way and at the same time every day. If you missed this presentation, all is not lost! 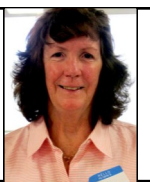
Thanks again and kudos to **Alan Katz** for the enlightening presentation on "Drugs Interactions" at our October meeting.

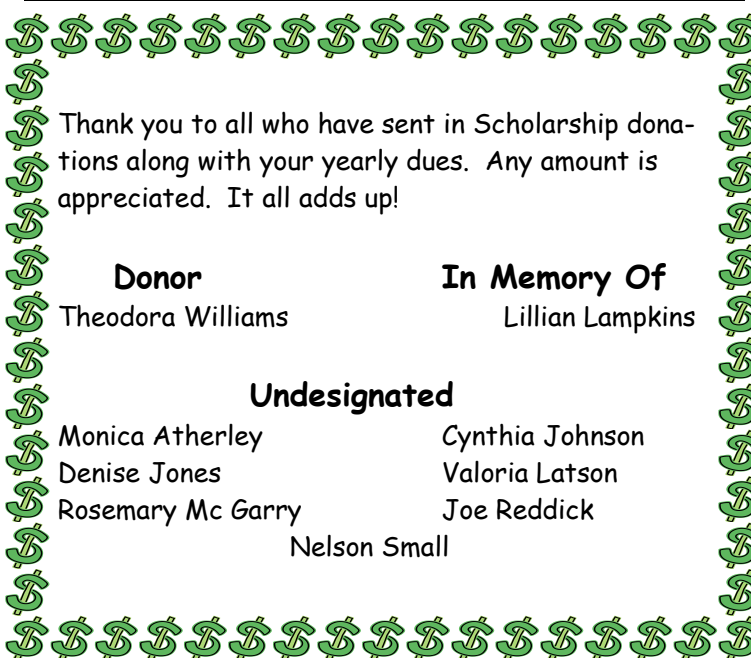

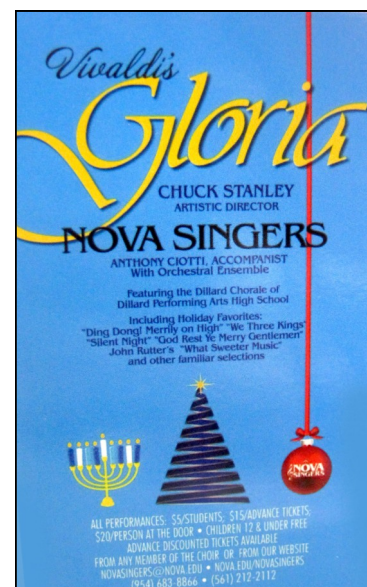

Proposed Revisions to BCREA Standing Rules

We will be discussing and voting on these changes at our November meeting
Under Responsibilities for Expenditures

D. General Assembly:

Current:

Travel is paid for the delegates when traveling by car at \$.56 per mile based on AAA mileage. If delegate uses other types of transportation (such as bus or airplane) the reimbursement is based on the mileage for a car. The association will pay for the registration and banquet ticket for up to seven delegates. FREA will pay the hotel room bill for the number of delegates in accordance with unit membership.

Proposed:

Travel is paid for the delegates when traveling by car based on the standard federal reimbursement rate chart. If delegates use other types of transportation, such as bus or airplane, the reimbursement is based on car mileage. The association will pay for registration and banquet tickets in accordance with unit membership; FREA will pay the hotel bill for the number of delegates in accordance with unit membership.

F. Programs

Current:

Speakers and performing groups at regularly scheduled meetings may be given an honorarium not to exceed \$150 from Association funds with prior approval of the Board.

Proposed:

Speakers and performing groups at regularly scheduled meetings may be given an honorarium not to exceed \$100 from Association funds, with prior approval of the Board
