All You Ever Wanted To Know About MODS



According to its website MODS.org, "the mission of the Museum of Discovery and Science is to provide experiential pathways to lifelong learning in science for children and adults through exhibits, programs and films."

The Museum began its his-

tory as the Discovery Center, a hands-on museum of art, science and history, in 1977 in the historic New River Inn. Undoubtedly, many of our members took their own children there. By 1986, community demand had far exceeded the Museum's capabilities in the

small complex and with the help of \$8 million from the City's General Obligation Bond began to build the museum as it is today.

With strong community support, the Museum then managed to get \$13.6 million in philanthropy and \$11 million in state funding for a total of \$32.6 million. These investments completed funding for the new Museum of Discovery and Science and the IMAX Theater, and funded a \$3 million permanent endowment. The IMAX Theater was renamed the AutoNation IMAX Theater in 2007 in recognition of a major gift. In 2018, the 27,000-square-foot Science Park opened in the backyard. Kids, school groups and parents regularly enjoy the fresh air and safe surroundings of the Science Park as they continue their exploration of the Museum outdoors. The most recent addition is the **Stemo**-



bile which is a mobile Museum which can be rented for events.

Meredith Ray Feder is Deputy Director for MODS. She and Diane Robiana, the Director of Education, spoke at the October BCREA meeting. From Sprouting STEM for early childhood to internships for high school students, they
