"Are you losing your eye-sight? Is someone in your family having trouble seeing? Are you feeling overwhelmed by your vision loss?" These are the questions posed on the cover of the booklet distributed to BCREA members at the March meeting by **Lighthouse of Broward Volunteer Coordinator Barbara Krantz**. She was invited to speak at the instigation of BCREA member **Shirley Ernst** who suffers from low vision as a result of macular degeneration and has been helped by the Lighthouse.



She is also "one of our best volunteers" according to Barbara. The Lighthouse motto, "Teaching Independence - Inspiring Hope" illustrates the goal of helping people to "re-engage" - to show people

with vision problems how to participate in the life they had before they were afflicted. "Shirley is a living example of this," Barbara states emphatically. And Shirley agrees wholeheartedly.

If you're having vision problems or know someone who is, "Go to the Lighthouse!" It's located at 650 North Andrews Avenue in Ft. Lauderdale. According to the Area Agency on Aging, statistics show that seniors continued to be victims of scammers at an alarming rate. We are advised to be informed and very careful. They offer these tips to help keep us aware of some things we can do to keep safe.

Don't purchase anything from anybody selling door-to-door or over the phone. This is true with charitable organizations. If you are interested, ask them to send you literature about the organization. After you have reviewed the material, you make the call to order or to make a contribution.

You are vulnerable from strangers and friends and family members. A lot of times children and grandchildren are guilty of financial deception. They sometimes deplete joint bank accounts or do not deliver care in exchange for monetary compensation or property. Surround yourself with trusted people who

Please do not bring any magazines to the April meeting. (It's still okay to bring in books and other items.)

[www.sheriff.org](http://www.sheriff.org). Pay attention to your bank and credit card statements. Be sure to report anything that seems suspicious.

Never give personal information on the phone unless you initiated it. Sign up for Do Not Call at 1-888-382-1222 or at [www.donotcall.gov](http://www.donotcall.gov). This will prevent telemarketers from bothering you. Be vigilant and report anything suspicious to law enforcement immediately.
