Health & I+PS

Coronavirus is an umbrella term that refers to a group of viruses causing diseases like SARS, MERS and COVID -19. The newest disease caused by the coronavirus was originally called novel coronavirus but in February, the World Health Organization gave us the name COVID-19. The CO stands for corona. VI is for virus. And D means disease. The 19 is for the year 2019, the year the disease first appeared in China.

Earlier projections that the coronavirus would be widespread in the US during March and April are here. There are now cases reported in Broward County. Precautions to take are similar to those currently used during our flu season. Most importantly, our generation is most vulnerable.

And from Pathologist **James Robb**:

- 1) NO HANDSHAKING!
- 2) Use ONLY your knuckle to touch light switches, elevator buttons, etc.... Lift gasoline dispenser with a paper towel or use a disposable glove.
- 3) Open doors with your

closed fist or hip - do not grasp the handle with your hand, unless there is no way to open the door. Especially important on bathroom and post office/commercial doors.

- 4) Use disinfectant wipes at the stores when they are available, including wiping the handle and child seat in grocery carts.
- 5) Wash your hands with soap for 20 seconds and/or use a 60% alcohol-based hand sanitizer whenever you return from ANY activity that involves locations where other people have been.
- 6) Keep a bottle of sanitizer available at each of your home's entrances and in your car for use after getting gas or touching other contaminated objects when you can't immediately wash your hands.
- 7) If possible, cough or sneeze into a disposable tissue and discard. Use your elbow only if you have. The clothing on your elbow will contain infectious virus that can be passed on for up to a week or more!
- 8) STOCK UP ON: Latex or nitrile latex disposable gloves, disposable surgical masks, hand sanitizers and zinc lozenges
