Next, talk to your brothers and sisters, aunts, uncles and cousins to learn what they can add. Look around your home for anything that has family information - such as a family Bible." Now would be a good time to acquire something in which to store the information and documents you locate - such as a good-size loose-leaf notebook with archive-quality plastic sleeves. Once you've exhausted your family resources in the search, you really need to have access to a computer to do online searches. Dr. Duay distributed a list of useful sites. One that seems to provide links to several others is http://

www.rootsweb.ancestry.com. A very useful link on this site is the Social Security ssdi.rootsweb.com.

This includes most people who died after 1962. To locate a person, add as little information as possible to the search form for the best results. For immigrants from 1892 - 1924, go to http://www.ellisisland.org.

Gordon Locksley has amassed extraordinary holdings of contemporary art since 1960. He and business partner George Shea began their careers as art dealers, opening in 1964 the Locksley Shea Gallery in Minneapolis, representing artists who are now considered modern masters: Andy Warhol, Donald Judd, and Brice Marden. After leaving Minneapolis and living in Rome and Cannes, Gordon Locksley settled in Fort Lauderdale. He continues to actively collect and commission new work, some of monumental scale that will be on view for the first time in this installation.
