

Neglected Birch State Park Undergoing Restoration

Although he had never been officially named the "Father of Ft. Lauderdale Beach," the brochure *Hugh Taylor Birch* states that this is perhaps an idea "whose time has come." In the more current brochure "Friends of BSP," we learn that Birch was recently inducted into the Ft. Lauderdale Hall of Fame and granted this title. In 1942 Birch donated 180 acres to the state stipulating that it should forever be protected from development and used

as a state park. Hugh Taylor Birch State Park opened in 1954. From the mid-60's to the mid-80's it had a million visitors a year. From then until now, that number has declined to 300,000 as many of the park amenities ceased to exist. Today The



Friends of BSP are involved in an all-out effort to return the park to its former glory.

Gale Butler, Executive Director of this group, speaking at the November meeting of BCREA, showed

a video about Birch and the park and discussed the efforts currently underway to restore it to its former glory. She distributed sev-

eral brochures and stressed the need for volunteers. Jobs range from the mundane (office work) to animal and plant caretakers to driving visitors around in golf carts! There is also a need for teachers to present educational programs. 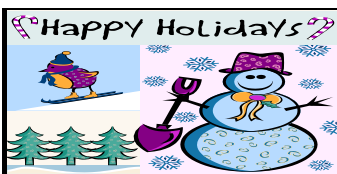

She became aware of this when she discovered a negative report on her credit report, resulting from unpaid bills sent to an address in Palm Beach County. However from this incident she received some very valuable information and wants to pass it on to all of us. After filling reports with the Fort Lauderdale Police and the FTC Louise went about the business of repairing her good credit. In the process she contacted BrightStar Credit Union. There she was put in touch

with a service called Balance which deals in wide variety of consumer counseling, including identity theft issues. BrightStar Credit Union offers this to all its members free of charge. There she was put in touch with a counselor who helped her spot irregularities in her three credit reports and how to refute them. The counselor was very helpful and very accessible, unlike one of the banks with which she does business. The good news is - Louise's credit is now restored! Louise advises us to get a free annual credit report and if you have any consumer or financial issues, contact BrightStar Credit Union.

Louise Costello.



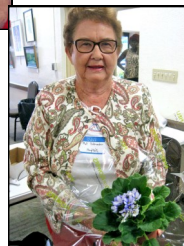

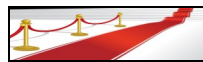

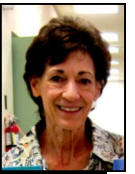
