


direction of Chief **Eddie Eagle Spirit** and led by Honor Guard Commander

Due to both the change of seasons and leaving Daylight Saving Time, there are several areas of concern which might need out attention. We do become a little more stressed at this time while trying to accomplish our holiday "to do list." Our physical surroundings becoming darker earlier and also those persistent scams permeate our mail boxes and phone! The more you have going on, the greater chances of your falling. As we become more distracted, we have a tendency to rush and become less in tune with our surroundings. Most falls are a combination of various things.

Darcy Drago has provided some suggestions, from her

doctor's office, which might help to increase our balance and keep us from falling. Find a good balance and exercise program to reduce muscle tightness (either out side of home or on your TV). Make sure to have your vision and hearing checked every year as they are a key to good balance and keeping you on your feet. Have your Doctor review your medications, as some side effects might increase your risk of falling. Add grab bars in key areas and always use handrails when traversing steps. Wear sturdy, non skid, rubber soled footwear and remove throw rugs. Traditionally this is the season of gifting and giving. There are web sites to help
