What Is Honor Flight?

Our speaker of the day was Bill Johansen Honor Flight South Florida is a 100% all-volunteer organization, dedicated solely to honoring all veterans in Broward, Dade, and Monroe counties. In the final chapters of their lives, it's a race against time to fly these veterans to Washington D.C. to visit and reflect at the memorials built in their honor. First priority for a trip is given to World War II veterans. Terminally ill veterans of any service period may be given the same priority as WWII veterans (physician statement required.)

The veteran's one-day mission to Washington D.C. includes round-trip airfare, deluxe bus transportation
