# Double Program: Both HANDY & Art Center Need Teachers

First on the program at the January meeting was Jeff Rusnak, Director of Develop-



ment of the Hollywood Art and Culture Center. According to its website, http:// artandculturecenter.org "The Art and Culture Center's educational program-

ming includes adult and children's arts classes, afterschool and outreach programs, camps, and other art curricula. In partnership with the Broward Education Communications Network. the Center offers distance learning visual and performing arts classes for all Broward County students. The Center also provides music/ drama/theater and visual arts programming for area schools." For these reasons, the Center is hoping to get volunteers from BCREA. For more information on the

Director of Programming Kirk Brown and Director of Development Becky Irwin represented HANDY at the meeting. According to their



website, http://handyinc.org "HANDY is a critical resource for children in Broward County's child protection system, providing a lifeline for our abused, neglected and disadvantaged youth." They work closely

with the Guardian ad Litem program to support both children and their caregivers. According to Brown, "No one who's ever been to Handy has walked out the same." At the present time they have 278 kids between the ages of 10 - 23. 90% of their clients graduate from high school and 905 of those go on to college. They need volunteers to tutor these kids - and who better to do this than retired teachers? Every subject is needed and tutoring is done every day except Sunday. The facility is located at 501 NE 8th Street - just across Federal Highway from Parker Playhouse. "I'm a social worker," he says; I work on lives; teachers work on brains!"
