

## Payne Reviews 1776

David McCullough writes, "'1776 was a year of all too few victories, of sustained suffering, disease, hunger, desertion, cowardice, disillusionment, defeat, terrible discouragement, and fear, ... but also of phenomenal courage, and bedrock devotion to country.'" In her review of this book, **Barbara Payne** tells us about that year – the year of the Declaration of Independence – and how very close our country came to remaining British! In the first few months of 1776, George Washington commanded an army that McCullough describes as little more than an unwashed mob, lacking uniforms, short on weapons and gunpowder, racked by typhus, dysentery and drunkenness. Their ages varied from 10 to 57 and, because



they were volunteers they saw little need for rules, coming and going at will. She tells of Nathaniel Greene, and Henry Knox, 2 ordinary men who became generals and heroes and, along with Washington, helped to hold the fledgling army together during 1776. Barbara, an alumna of Ft. Lauderdale High where she taught journalism for 4 years, also worked for the *Ft. Lauderdale News*.


