One year ago, on April 16, Dr. Howard Hepburn was appointed Superintendent of Broward County Public Schools. Dr. Hepburn grew up in Belle Glade, Florida. He attended the University of Central Florida on a scholarship, where he received a Bache-Ior's Degree in Science Education and a Master's in Educational Leadership. He holds a Doctorate in Educational Leadership from Florida Southern University. His two decades of career experience include being a classroom teacher, coach, dean, assistant principal, and principal. He served as the Instructional Superintendent in the Glades Region and the South Region of Palm Beach County Schools. In 2023, he joined BCPS as the Deputy Superintendent of Teaching and Learning. Under his instructional leadership, Broward regained its A-Rated District Status, which it had lost in 2011.




First, I want to personally thank Dr. Howard Hepburn, Superintendent of Broward County Public Schools, for coming to speak at our April 3rd meeting. Jennifer Kerkhof, his Executive Assistant, and James Knapp, CEO of Broward Education Foundation, accompanied him. Next, my report from Tallahassee: 1. The leadership at the Capitol seems friendlier than in the past. The Speaker of the House and Senate President are doing things differently; they are ONLY dealing with bills that concern the budget. 2. Our small but mighty group of ten spoke with over 60 aides and legislators! They were very interested in our concerns, especially reinstating the COLA and the fact that we had a workable solution for the current problem. We suggest not going retro back to 2011 because it is too expensive. (Billions!) Our solution is to start NOW with a lower percentage COLA each year. Several aides/legislators suggested how we can get a bill written for next year. We felt the time was right for them to listen to our suggestions. We will need EVERY-ONE to help get this written into a bill. 3. Now what?
