Fort Lauderdale's sometimes-controversial **Mayor Jim Naugle** is a hometown boy! Born at Broward General, he attended Peters Elementary, Plantation HS, graduated from Stranahan, BCC and FAU. Both his mother and sister were teachers in his schools and he had both for classes! While attending BCC he took a government class and decided to write about city government for one project. He interviewed the then-mayor **Virginia Young** - and the rest is part of the city's history! He was elected to the city commission in 1985 and became mayor in 1991. He is the longest-serving mayor in the city's history. Because of term limits enacted in 2000, he must step down in 2009. As mayor, he says most of his time is spend reading - everything from several newspapers to city documents - processing information so he can make good decisions. Because he is a "legislative" mayor and not a "strong" mayor, he conducts meetings and makes public appearances;

he does not actually run the day-to-day operations of the city which is done by the city manager. One of his favorite duties is meeting the captains of Navy vessels which dock in Ft. Lauderdale and having lunch onboard the ships. He opened the floor for questions. **Joanne Davis** asked, "Who's responsible for sidewalk repair?" Surprisingly, the homeowner is, but the city recently voted to split costs. **John Curran**



asked about the possibility of a water shortage. "There will never be a shortage of water, just



cheap water," was the answer. To insure this, the city has recently begun to use desalinization on a small scale, he added. **Madeline Martin** asked, "How do we get sister cities?" The city has 16 sister cities - and he can name them all! The main point to be considered when selecting them is whether or not there is a local community to support them. Not even one question was asked that might have been considered controversial!

An award will be given

to any BCREA member who has recruited at least **FOUR (4) NEW** members during the 2008-2009 membership year. (The person who is recruited must not have been a member of BCREA/FREA anytime in the previous four (4) years.) An award will be given at the final BCREA meeting on May 7 and another presentation at the State Assembly in late May.

REVIEWING THE TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP

Active Membership is

open to any person who has retired with five or more years of service from the educational field under the Florida Retirement System, or from the educational system of another state or a private or parochial school. This would apply to persons retiring from Non-Instructional positions as well as Instructional positions. Active members of the BCREA should also become members of the Florida Retired Educators Association. Dues are \$45., which includes the \$30 for FREA.

Associate Membership is

open for spouses of members and anyone interested in the work of this association. Associate members pay the dues for BCREA membership with all rights and privileges except the right to vote, hold office or represent the association. Associate Dues for BCREA are \$15.
