

Runcie Redux Results in Rapid Recounting

For the second year in a row, Broward Superintendent of Schools **Robert W. Runcie** was the kick-off speaker for the BCREA club year, drawing a total of 102 to hear him speak. Arriving like "Hurricane Runcie" and speaking at a rapid rate, he explained that one person had expressed the opinion that he must be twins, so many places did he appear. In a manner similar to last year, Mr. Runcie updated his "State of the Schools" report, emphasizing the advancements in technology and early childhood development in the past year. They have repurposed Lauderdale Manors Elementary as a family center and Lauderdale Middle School as a Birth-3 center. They are using "Innovations for Learning," an online mentoring program for kids in K - 3. He discussed a new program: "Digital 5," in which all 5th graders are issued com-




puters. This is being implemented at 27 elementary schools. The county has submitted requests for \$20 - \$30 million to expand this program to middle schools. "Feedback is enormously encouraging," he states. In working to make all students college-and-career-ready, they are expanding online programs to prepare students for future jobs. An

example of success in the area of online studies is a young man from McArthur HS who has won regional and state competitions and gone on to nationals - all through online study. There is even a K-12 online school - Broward Virtual School. Among the challenges he's faced in the past year is the continuing problem of class size. When he took the job, over 70% of classes were out of compliance and the state had been assessed a \$66 million

fine; now, 87% are in compliance. Unfortunately, in the restructuring of high school classes to improve the situation, new problems have been created. Moving back to a yearly 7-period day from the block system of 4 classes per semester has not been accepted without complaint. Pay raises for teachers was also a concern addressed by members during a Q & A session that had to be cut short because of time. And he was off to his next engagement!
