Due to the generosity of Evelyn & Jim Morris, \$53,000+ was left to BCREA in their wills. A committee - MaryEllen Fowler, Chair; Ann French, Marelise LeClerc; Maria Tracy; Diane Jarchow;



Barbara Lewis; Jean Anderson; Karen Avery; Sue Colton (guest member) was formed to devise usage for the monies. The committee proposed the expenditure of \$10,000 a year for 5 years to provide grants to School Board employees in order to further their education in the field of education and to fund projects for school sites. The grant area was approved by the BCREA Board while the project division will be revisited next year. Additional information is forthcoming concerning dates for applications.

After you cast and mail your ballot, you can track its status by going to https://ballottrax.net.

Important - If you want to vote by mail, you MUST request a vote by mail ballot by 10/29/2022

Remember to vote by mail, in person at early voting sites or on election day. It is critical and your responsibility.

Before you gather the candy for your neighborhood trick or treaters, please remember that October is Breast Cancer Awareness month. One in eight women will develop breast cancer in her lifetime. Make sure you take time to get a mammogram or encourage your friends to do the same.

In November, BCREA will host Dr. Vickie Cartwright, Superintendent of Broward County Public Schools. Dr Cartwright took over the helm at Broward, the sixth largest school system in the country, in February 2022 and is the county's first female superintendent. She comes to Broward via Wisconsin and Orlando, Florida.

Her 2022-23 message for the district is "Leading" with Relationships, Grace, and Respect."


