BCREA Awards 4 Scholarships





YOU KNOW YOU ARE A LITERACY VOLUNTEER IF: You tutor adults or children, work in a library, help with book fairs, assist Friends of the Library, assist in the classroom, assist with testing programs, purchase books for non-readers or readers who need to improve their reading skills, you are a Reading Buddy, you tell or read stories to children, adults or in nursing homes, you read to your grandchildren or help them with homework, you teach Sunday School, you are a judge for any essay contest, you are reading for the blind, you are a monitor in a computer lab, you help students prepare for their GED, you are a mentor or in training to be one, you are working in an English As A Second Language Program, you help students prepare for college entrance exams, you are a tutor trainer, you serve on the board of a literacy council or coalition, you are a SHINE counselor, you work in after school programs, you are a Surrogate Parent, you write grants to assist schools/literacy councils.

Just remember that whatever you do that helps improve the reading, writing and math skills of student, children and adults, count as Literacy.
