There have been many changes to voting in Florida since the 2022 Legislative session - new precincts, new eligibility requirements, and new voting locations. There are 3 ways to vote:

Vote by Mail - What is the deadline for requesting a mail in ballot?

Early Voting - What are the dates?

In-Person Voting on Tuesday, November 8 - Where do I cast my vote?

You will also be able to check your registration status courtesy of Judy Mager and her laptop. Judy is the FREF District 10 Trustee, and she will also update us on FREF scholarships and programs.
